

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7

Tormented by thirst, the people complained against Moses. 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt?' they said. 'Was it so that I should die of thirst, my children too, and my cattle?' Moses appealed to the Lord. 'How am I to deal with this people?' he said. 'A little more and they will stone me!' The Lord said to Moses, 'Take with you some of the elders of Israel and move on to the forefront of the people; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the river, and go. I shall be standing before you there on the rock, at Horeb. You must strike the rock, and water will flow from it for the people to drink.' This is what Moses did, in the sight of the elders of Israel. The place was named Massah and Meribah because of the grumbling of the sons of Israel and because they put the Lord to the test by saying, 'Is the Lord with us, or not?'

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

Through our Lord Jesus Christ by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. This hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners.

Gospel Acclamation

God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son,
that all who believe in him might have eternal life.

Gospel: John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

Lent is a wonderful time to reflect on our own responses to God's love. We are all the church, and therefore have our part to play in ensuring that the church is what the Lord intends it to be. Lent in particular is a time when we try to listen to what the Spirit may be saying to us about our lives; it is a time when as individuals and as a community we are called to allow the Spirit to renew our lives so that we conform more fully to the image and likeness of Christ.

There will be no 40-hour adoration this year, it will be replaced by 12 hours of adoration. This year this will be taking place at Birkdale in the Chapel on Saturday 20 March, beginning at 6:00 am and finishing prior to the 6:15pm Mass. This beautiful time of silent prayer where we fulfil the call of Jesus "to spend one hour with me." Please consider offering one hour or more during this one day adoration. There are rosters in the foyers of both our Churches for you to place your name. Also, a priest will be available for individual confession from 10:00 am to 11:00 am and in the afternoon from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge invites four or five parishioners from each parish to the Annual Christ Mass to be held on Thursday 25 March at 7 pm at the Cathedral of St Stephen—this is a celebration for the entire Archdiocese. As this Mass will be ticketed, those interested will also need to book online through the Cathedral website.

This year our Holy week liturgies will be shared between Birkdale and Manly Parishes. The Liturgy of the Holy Thursday will be celebrated at St. John Vianney's Church, Manly at 6.00 pm. On Good Friday we will have the Stations of the Cross at 10 am, St. John Vianney's, Manly, and the Liturgy of the passion of the Lord at 3.00 pm at St. Mary Mackillop, Birkdale. The Great Vigil of Easter Masses will be held in St. John Vianney's Church, Manly at 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm at Birkdale. Then on Easter Sunday there will be normal mass at Gumdale at 7:00 am Birkdale at 8:00 am and 9:30 at Manly.
