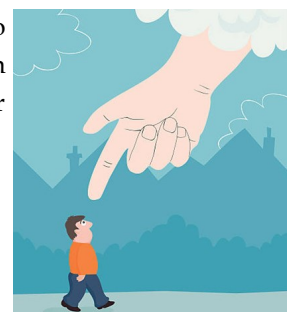
FOR THE CHILDREN

FIRST READING ISAIAH 66:18-21

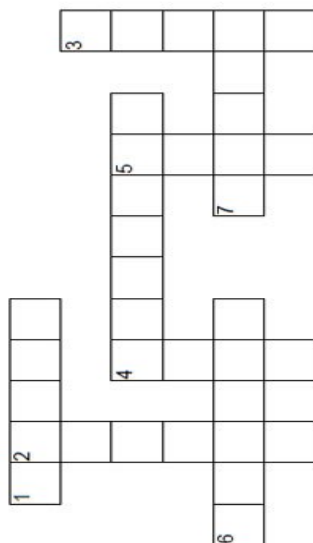

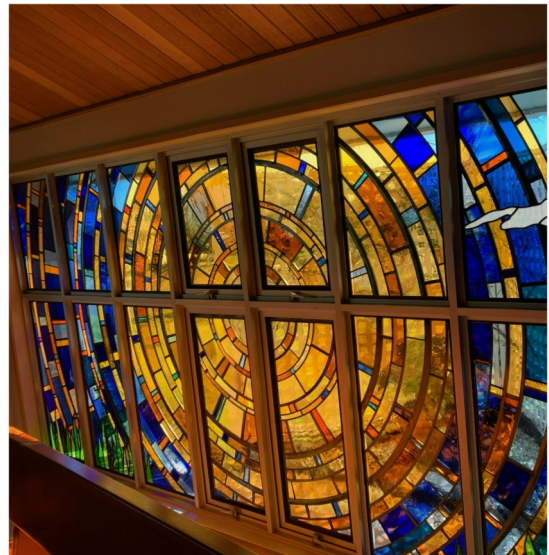
issue of domestic and family violence. The statement can be viewed at www.socialjustice.catholic.org.au.
