Welcome to St John Vianney's Catholic Parish!

The Sacred Scriptures and the Creed: this is what we believe

The Mass consists of four main sections. They are: Introductory Rites; Liturgy of the Word; Liturgy of the Eucharist and; Concluding Rites. The Liturgy of the Word is one of the major parts of the Mass during which the Word of God is proclaimed, responded to, explained and accepted. The Scriptures are God's word spoken to us today. When we gather for the Mass, we hear our story - God's story of His love for us - through Sacred Scriptures. We tell these stories whenever we gather for Mass because these scriptures reinforce what we believe, to whom we belong, and our relationship with others and with God. Through the Liturgy of the Word, God speaks to us personally and is fully present to us. We must be open to God's presence by turning a listening ear and heart to the Sacred Scripture proclaimed during the Liturgy.

If we read the readings before we go to Church, when we hear them proclaimed, the Word of God will have more depth and God will be able to use the Scriptures to speak to us more easily. Spending quality time in prayer with the readings before Mass, whether ten minutes or a half hour depending on your schedule, will significantly improve our receptivity to God's Word as it is proclaimed.

"The Liturgy of the Word is to be celebrated in such a way as to favour meditation, and so any kind of haste such as hinders recollection is clearly to be avoided. In the course of it, brief periods of silence are also appropriate, accommodated to the assembled congregation; by means of these, under the action of the Holy Spirit, the Word of God may be grasped by the heart and a response through prayer may be prepared. It may be appropriate to observe such periods of silence, for example, before the Liturgy of the Word itself begins, after the First and Second Reading, and lastly at the conclusion of the Homily" (GIRM 56).

On Sundays and Solemnities, the Profession of Faith or Creed will follow. "Instead of the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed (Nicene Creed), especially during Lent and Easter Time, the baptismal Symbol of the Roman Church, known as the Apostles' Creed, may be used" (The Order of the Mass page 528). The word "creed" itself comes from the first word in Latin: "credo" means "I believe" (CCC 187). So we can certainly say that the Creed is something which we believe and hold to be true. Here's how the Catechism of the Catholic Church begins its explanation: "Whoever says 'I believe' says 'I pledge myself to what I believe.' Communion in faith needs a common language of faith, normative for all and uniting all in the same confession of faith." (CCC 185). In brief, the Creed is a concise summary of the principle truths that we agree to as a Church. Rooted in the Scriptures and written centuries ago, the Creed continues to hold meaning in our lives today. Spend time with it. Reflect on the words. Bring it to prayer because this is what we believe.

Check In OLD App Requirements

'Check in QLD App' is required at all Mass centres

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered - it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost - it is the Lord who speaks!

'See the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks—when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. and this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity.'

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. 
16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B THE SHEPHERD AND HIS FLOCK
