Finding joy in waiting for Jesus....

This weekend is the First Sunday in Advent and the beginning of a new Church year. It is also the beginning of a new cycle of prayers and scripture readings, cycle C. Why are these four weeks before Christmas called "Advent"? The term comes from a Latin word 'adventus' meaning 'coming, arrival'. We immediately think it refers to the coming of Jesus at Christmas time and that is correct. But that's not the whole story. In fact, we can speak of three comings of the Lord and all are referred to in the Scripture readings this weekend.

On this day, the Church invites us to be ready and prepared to receive the Lord. When the coming of someone is delayed, we usually become anxious and worried. However, today's readings invite us to find joy in our waiting. During this season, we first participate in the waiting of the Israelites who were expecting their Messiah. Secondly, we wait for the coming of Jesus in the breaking of the Word and of the Bread in the Eucharistic celebration.

Finally, we look forward to our future with a hope and wait for the coming of Jesus at the end of time to judge the world. Thus, the Church invites us to make use of Advent and prepare ourselves in such a way that by means of promoting justice, hope, love and peace in our lives and those of others, we get to witness the promises about the coming of Jesus being fulfilled in our time, here and now.

Archdiocese of Brisbane COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements

The Archdiocese of Brisbane is committed to protecting our employees, contractors, volunteers and those they serve. As Queensland's borders will open in the coming weeks we are preparing for increased risk of COVID-19 infection in the community. Therefore, the Archdiocese has made the decision that some specific volunteer roles will require vaccination. These specific roles are: Leaders of Children's Liturgy of the Word and the Sacramental Program, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick who attend Hospitals, Nursing Homes and/or Private Homes, and Safeguarding Local Officers. Volunteers do not have to be vaccinated under this policy where that position is solely related to activities that are purely domestic, social, recreational, religious or private in nature, including Mass. To meet the requirements we require evidence of your vaccination. This proof can be provided in the form of a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate or an Immunisation History Statement.
