#### Welcome to St John Vianney's Catholic Parish!

Our parish is known for being friendly and welcoming, as well as for active participation at Mass through music and prayer. There is a place here for everyone; we hope that you will join us. If you have any questions, concerns or suggestions, please contact the parish office . We are all Advent people.... We enter into the Second Sunday of Advent. This season of Advent tells us about the coming of Emmanuel, "God with us". It is the time we recall how our God comes to earth to take on human form and live on earth just as we live. He does it as He shares His life and love with us. Because God shares His love with us, He invites us to share our love with Him and with others. Advent is the time of waiting as we prepare ourselves to welcome the God who became man and who by example showed us how we too should be able to live like Him for others. Within this period of advent, the voice of God which came through John the Baptist still resounds in the teachings of the Church calling us to prepare the way for the Lord who is coming into our hearts both as the new born king and as the judge of the living and the dead.

To prepare the way for the Lord in our hearts, two things are suggested to us as we can learn from John the Baptist. The first is that we need to go into the wilderness of our hearts where we are alone with God and enjoy His presence. This could be done through private meditation, contemplative prayer, bible reading and participation in Church fellowships. In doing this, we silence the distractions of the busy world. Secondly, when we are settled in the wilderness like John, God reveals His Word to us as He revealed it to John. This Word illuminates our minds and then allow it to inform, reform and transform us into what God wants us to be.

Advent is the time to get ready. And how do we get ready? We turn away from our sins, from the distracting things of our material lives, and turn toward God, asking His pardon and forgiveness in so far as we pardon and forgive others who have offended us. Dear friends, let us turn to God and prepare our hearts to receive Him again at Christmas, with peace that surpasses understanding, leaving the sadness that is stopping us from really living, levelling the mountains and valleys of our lives and in that way, we will be ready for the coming of the little child who will be born in us again this year.

#### Archdiocese of Brisbane COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements

The Archdiocese of Brisbane is committed to protecting our employees, contractors, volunteers and those they serve. As Queensland's borders will open in the coming weeks we are preparing for increased risk of COVID-19 infection in the community. Therefore, the Archdiocese has made the decision that some specific volunteer roles will require vaccination. These specific roles are: Leaders of Children's Liturgy of the Word and the Sacramental Program, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick who attend Hospitals, Nursing Homes and/or Private Homes, and Safeguarding Local Officers. Volunteers do not have to be vaccinated under this policy where that position is solely related to activities that are purely domestic, social, recreational, religious or private in nature, including Mass. To meet the requirements we require evidence of your vaccination. This proof can be provided in the form of a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate or an Immunisation History Statement. ### First Reading: Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

**Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

#### Second Reading: Philippians 1:406, 8-11

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare your for the Day of Christ, when you will reach perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

#### **Gospel Acclamation**

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

#### **Gospel:** Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah: A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
