The Baptism of the Lord - 9 January 2022

Today we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus. This is the second epiphany of Jesus. At His baptism, Jesus is revealed to the Jews as the promised Messiah.

The baptism of the Lord reminds us of our own baptism.

The most important thing that happened in our Christian life was our baptism. This sacrament emphasizes our relationship with our Father in heaven.

Indeed, through our baptism we become sons and daughters of our heavenly Father. But being baptized as children of God would make no sense if we do not practice our faith and live like children of God. Baptism, like the sacrament of Ordination and marriage is something to be lived every day of our lives.

The baptism of Jesus tells us of our identity.

By baptism we become sons and daughters of God, members of his Church, heirs of heaven and temples of the Holy Spirit. It tells us who we are and to whom we belong to.

The baptism of Jesus also reminds us of our mission:

First of all- our mission is to experience the presence of God within us, and to appreciate God's presence in others by honouring them, loving them and serving them in all humility.

Secondly-our mission is to live as the children of God in thought, word and action.

Thirdly, to lead a holy and transparent Christian life and not to desecrate our human bodies (the temples of the Holy Spirit) by impurity, drugs, excessive drinking, suicide, abortion etc.

Fourthly, to grow daily in intimacy with God. This intimacy could be developed only through our personal and family prayers, meditative reading of the word of God, by participation in the Holy Mass, by frequenting the sacrament of reconciliation, by doing works of charity etc.

Let us always be in touch with the Holy Spirit, the source of divine power, who came to Jesus and who also came on us at our baptism and confirmation. Let us live the baptism in our lives as it is the guarantee of our eternal life. Let us reject Satan and his evils ways and profess our faith in Jesus.

Vaccination Requirements for Volunteers

As you may have seen in previous newsletters, the Archdiocese of Brisbane has made the decision that some specific volunteer roles will require COVID vaccination. These specific volunteer roles include: Leaders of Children's Liturgy of the Word and the Sacramental Program, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick who attend hospitals, nursing homes and/or private homes and local safeguarding officers. Volunteers do not have to be vaccinated under this policy where that position is solely related to activities that are purely domestic, social, recreational, religious or private in nature, including Mass. To meet the requirements we require evidence of your vaccination. This proof can be provided in the form of a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate or an Immunisation History Statement as a PDF. This Week's Readings

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

'Console my people, console them,' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

Second Reading: Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
