1st READING:- Deuteronomy 26:4-10 A reading from the book of Genesis Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' COVID-19 Restrictions

Restrictions as of 4/03/22:

- Masks will no longer be required indoors. For the protection and peace of mind of vulnerable parishioners, the priest and other communion ministers may wish to wear a mask during the distribution of Holy Communion. Current practices of hand sanitisation should remain in place.
- Places of worship will no longer have capacity limits, and this will include funerals and weddings.
- Pew cleaning after Masses is no longer required.

- Normal collection practices may resume, that is, the collection basket may be passed around.
- The Procession of Gifts may resume.
- The Rite of Reconciliation can be made available as per pre-Covid arrangements.
- Parishes can immediately resume all forms of food service. As a matter of caution, we encourage parishes to minimise the shared handling of serving tongs, milk jugs etc to reduce risk of transmitting the COVID contact with shared utensils. Please also remain vigilant with hand hygiene.
