Gospel Reflection

The Pharisee and the tax collector are images of two extreme religious attitudes. Pharisees, as the great keepers of the holy law, were held in great esteem by the Jewish community. Tax collectors were Jews who worked for Rome. They would pay a predetermined amount to the government for the right to collect taxes from the people of a particular territory. To recoup their investment and make a profit they would collect outrageous taxes from the people. Tax collectors were despised by Jewish society as thieves and collaborators.

The parable contrasts two very different attitudes of prayer. The Pharisee approaches God seeking the reward he feels he deserves. His prayer is really a testimonial to himself for all the good things he has done to merit God's grace. On the other hand, the tax collector realises his nothingness before God. He seeks God's mercy for all the good things God has done for undeserving sinners like himself.

Like the Pharisee in today's Gospel, we can "use" God to justify our own belief systems and to advance our own idea of what the world should be. The Christ of compassion and reconciliation calls us to see ourselves as made in God's image, not to recast God in our

In our own time and place, the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector is played out not so much as a lack of humility before God but as a lack of awareness of the needs, hopes and cries for help of those around us.

Attitude and action are the essence of authentic discipleship, not just words and rituals empty of feeling or conviction. We manifest our love for God not through self-righteous acts of piety but through our love and care for the poor, the needy, the defenceless, the alienated and the rejected.
