Those who are "salt of the earth" are not those we admire for their virtue or holiness – they are the ones who bring out the goodness in us and everyone else. Those who are a "light for the world" divert attention from themselves in order to illuminate the goodness of God in our midst. To become "salt" in the spirit of Christ is to bring forth the "flavour" of God in everyone and everything; to be "light" that is a true reflection of Christ, is to illuminate the presence of God in the midst of the dark and the cold, the hidden and the unclear.
