A phone call

Mia was a mother of a three-year-old son, trapped in an abusive marriage, and an addict. One night she hit rock bottom, and in desperation rang the number of a Christian counsellor her mother had given her. The phone rang. A man answered.

"Hi, I got this number from my mother. Uh, do you think you could

Mia heard shuffling at the other end of the line. A little radio in the background was snapped off and the man who answered became very present. "Yes, yes, yes. What's going on?"

For the first time, Mia poured out her story. She told him that she wasn't feeling good, things were bad in her marriage, she had a drug problem and she was scared.

The man didn't judge. He just sat with her and listened. She was encouraged by his kindness and gentleness. The man stayed up the whole night with her, just talking, listening and being there until the sun rose. By daybreak, Mia had calmed down. The raw panic had passed and she was feeling okay.

Mia was grateful. "Hey, you know, I really appreciate what you've done for me tonight. You're very good at this. I mean, you've seriously done a big thing for me. How long have you been a Christian counsellor?"

There was a long pause at the other end of the line. "Mia, please don't hang up. I've been trying not to bring this up, but the number you called," He paused, "You got the wrong number." Mia didn't hang up and they talked a little longer. She never got his name or called him back.

Mia survived that night. She's now a successful writer; she raised her little boy alone, to become a magnificent young athlete and scholar. She concludes her story of that night:
