FEAST OF THE BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST - CORPUS CHRISTI

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6: 51-58)

Church Teaching...

Recalling these words of Jesus, the Catholic Church professes that, in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink"

The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul and divinity under the appearances of bread and wine - the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist is called "real", not to exclude other types of his presence as if they could not be understood as real (cf. *Catechism*, no. 1374). The risen Christ is present to his Church in many ways, but most especially through the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

What does it mean that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine? How does this happen? The presence of the risen Christ in the Eucharist is an inexhaustible mystery that the Church can never fully explain in words.

So today we celebrate our parish's table of memories: the place where we come together at our most joyful celebrations and our most devastating moments, to remember the love of God's Christ as he asked us to remember him: as "living bread", blessed, broken and shared.

At this table, we become the community envisioned by Jesus: a community of giving, a community of consolation, a community of peace. This table is our connection not only to one another but to all who came before us and all who will come after us to this same table to break bread in the eternal memory of Jesus. On this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, may our prayer be that our family tables - no matter how large or small, how simple or elegant - may be extensions of God's banquet table in the kingdom of heaven.
