SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR A "A sower went out to sow. Some of the seed fell on the path, and the birds came and ate it up... Other seed fell on good soil and brought forth grain." (Matthew 13: 1-23)

Parenting, Act 1...

Most nights after dinner, she and her daughters dance together. The dancing is more jumping around and includes loud off-key singing and crazy hair-swinging. "What we lack in rhythm we more than make up for in laughter," she says, "and I love to see my little girls this way: joyful, silly, and happy to have me around." But she knows this won't last forever. This is Act 1 in the parent-child relationship. Act 2 will begin in the blink of an eye: "when they will die of embarrassment to see me dancing."

She remembers dancing with her mum when she was a little girl. And singing in the car and snuggling up to her in bed when she read those special stories. Then came Act 2: shutting herself in her room to listen to "her" music, reading on her own, preferring the company of her friends to time with her mum. But there is an Act 3 in the mother-daughter relationship. She remembers:

"When I was in my early 20s and living in another city, I went home for a long weekend to visit my parents. The table was cleared, my dad had gone to bed, and it was just mum and me sitting on the couch together, in our pyjamas, chatting about what was new with her and me and her friends and my friends. I remember snuggling into her and her stroking my hair, just like she used to do when I was a child, as we talked and talked."

In Act 3 we went to movies again, went shopping, even went on road trips together. We talked most days, laughed often, cried some, too. By that point I was my own person, but I had grown into someone who loved having her around, just as I had when I was little. And so, while I try to savor every hug, kiss, laugh, and sigh from my daughters, knowing that they'll never be this little again and they'll never again need me with the same intensity, I also try to keep in mind that hopefully we'll have an Act 3 where we can all dance together once more."

The "3 acts" of parenthood that Laura Shea Souza writes about are "seeds sown" by mums and dads in the course of their children's life: seeds of patience, understanding, forgiveness, compassion. The parable of the sower speaks especially to parents: that Mum and Dad's own example of selflessness and humility, compassion and generosity, are "seeds" that are planted in the minds and hearts of their daughters and sons that will mature one day into their own harvest of generosity and forgiveness, and the "seeds" of that same harvest they will then "sow" in the lives of their own children.

WITH LAMPS ABLAZE **Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese** of Brisbane from 2023

For 2023 and beyond, Archbishop Mark Coleridge took time to set down the Apostolic priorities of the Brisbane Archdiocese. These are known as With Lamps Ablaze and were conceived and developed under the influence of the Holy Spirit, who is moving in the Church in new and surprising ways.

The priorities are termed 'apostolic' rather than 'pastoral' or 'missionary' and this is intended specifically to invest all of us who form the body of Christ as stakeholders. While the bishops are the successors of the apostles, it is no less true that the whole Church, the community of all the baptised, is 'apostolic'. That sense of inclusiveness is foundational to these priorities, and what each of them seeks to further promote both individually and as a collective.

The Seven Apostolic Priorities are:

- 1. **Teaching Prayer**
- 2. **Reshaping Parish Communities**
- 3. Bringing Cultural Communities to the Centre
- 4. **Responding to Abuse and the Abused**
- 5. **Engaging anew with First Nations Peoples**
- 6. Implementing Integral Ecology
- 7. Imbedding Synodal Governance
