You are asked to respond to two questions:


- 1. As a parish, what have you done well?

Whole-hearted love

This Sunday's Gospel reading reminds us that we cannot love God without loving ourselves and others, but God must always come first. And this is only possible if we fully open our hearts and our lives to receive the unconditional, amazing love that God has for us.

When we have difficulty loving God with all our heart, mind and soul all the time, every day, every moment, no matter what's going on, it's usually because we're spending too much time focused on other people and/or on our own plans and wishes! And it's because we don't truly understand that God is loving us with all of his heart, mind, and soul.

Yes, we must focus on others in order to love them. And yes we must focus on our own needs so that we can love others as much as we love ourselves. Our own needs are important and we are responsible for seeing that our needs get met; otherwise we don't have enough to share with others enough energy, enough enthusiasm, enough kindness, enough patience, etc. Likewise, we can't focus so much on ourselves that we neglect the needs of others.

So the guestion then becomes: What are the priorities? In other words: How much time should we spend alone with God? How much time should we spend nurturing ourselves? How much of our time and needs and wants should be sacrificed for the sake of others?

Interestingly, we find the right balance only after we put God first and make our relationship with him our highest priority. This divine friendship is what heals us in our unmet needs. It's what empowers us to love others even when they are difficult to love. And we don't have to be alone with God all day to have intimacy with him.

We love him first and foremost simply by relying on him for success in loving others and ourselves. As long as we keep turning to him for guidance, healing and strength, we are loving him with all our heart, mind and soul all the time, every day, every moment, no matter what's going on.

ST JUDE'S UPDATE

For a number of years the Parish Finance Council has been engaged in extensive talks with the Archdiocese regarding the sale or lease of a large portion of the land at St Jude's that is surplus to our needs.

We have recently been informed that the Archdiocese have been involved in discussions with the State Government to identify potential surplus land owned by various parishes which the government may be interested in purchasing or leasing for affordable and/or social housing, and that St Jude's surplus land has been discussed at a recent meeting. The model the State has proposed is a 40-year lease with an upfront payment of 60% of the valuation of the land (currently ~\$5M). There would be minimal cost to the Parish as the State would be responsible for the development and management of the housing project. At the end of the 40 years, the land and all improvements (roads, housing, infrastructure) would be returned to the Parish.

The next round of discussions between the State Government and the Archdiocese is scheduled for November. Please pray for a satisfactory outcome from these discussions.
